An important issue facing the Michigan Natural Resources Commission is whether to allow hunting of Sandhill Cranes. Michigan Audubon is encouraging everyone to oppose this issue; for a variety of reasons, not the least of which is the fact that the Sandhill Cranes were almost brought to extinction in the early previous century because of hunting and habitat destruction. Other states still have it listed as Endangered, and Michigan's precarious success bolsters these struggling flocks in other areas. Their comeback success story is heralded and appreciated by many, and the reasons for creating a hunting season have already been addressed with rational. scientific solutions, including special hunting permits for farmers whose crops are threatened, or better yet, a special coating on the seed corn deterring them from eating


