FROM INSECTS TO BERRIES by Martin Blagdurn As cold weather approaches, Michigan has 3 common species of insect-eating birds that overwinter on a regular basis, so don't be surprised to see them in December, January, February and March. Our state bird, the American Robin, switches from worms to berries so they can get through the cold days of winter. Also Eastern Bluebirds go from flying insects to berries. Our other winter berry eaters are Cedar Waxwings. This gregarious species typically appears in flocks and will take over a bush or tree until all the berries are gone. Robins and Bluebirds also form small groups of their own during the cold months. There are other Thrush type species that occasionally remain in Michigan in winter: Hermit Thrush – Gray Catbird – Brown Thrasher, that are usually single birds that feed in thickets and gullies. Another occasional species is the Bohemian Waxwing that appear in flocks of their own but can also associate with Cedar Waxwings. Finally, there is a warbler that can survive in early winter eating berries - the Yellow-rumped Warbler, formerly known as Myrtle Warbler for the berries it favors.
