With less than 20,000 lakes, Minnesota is aptly named "Land of 10,000 lakes," however Finland, with closer to 200,000 lakes, is more deserving of the name. Finland is bordered by Sweden, Norway and Russia, and has enormous expanses of boreal forest, many thousands of lakes and weaving waterways. Finland's treasures in spring are manyfold: great grouse, owls, woodpeckers, and finches in wild forests, woodland mammals including large carnivores along the frontier with Russia, and throngs of waterfowl, marsh birds,

## Purple Martin nest boxes on Windmill Is. *by Martin B*

The Windmill Island effort which started last fall when we cleaned out 96 nest boxes continued 2 weeks ago when we activated half of the nest boxes by



removing the hole covers and laying in a handful of White Pine needles. The houses were also labeled and numbered in preparation for data collection. Several missing peak perches were also replaced, and metal stops were installed bv Windmill staff which will make raising and lowering the houses easier. On March 29th Robin and I met our 1st volunteer monitor, Rich Dirske.



and observed the houses for about 90 minutes, We didn't see any but we have a starting point of data now, we will see what happens over the coming weeks.


